


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VISION STATEMENT



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


GUIDING PRINCIPLES

Our Aspirations Reflect Our Values

- We are all part of, responsible for, and have a direct impact upon our world.
 Productive citizenship requires that students thoroughly understand how their local and global communities work, and how individuals and communities affect each other.
- Understanding the relationships between humans and the world they share
 is the primary goal of education. For students to appreciate their place and
 role in their environment and respond with wonder and confidence their
 learning experiences must be embedded in multiple human and natural
 contexts.
- To thrive in an age in which complexity and opportunity are created at an ever-accelerating pace, students must become skilled in a balanced mix of the language arts, mathematics, and physical, natural and social sciences, as well as artistic, musical and athletic expression.
- Technological understanding and competence are increasingly essential for communication, competitiveness, and success in the information age.
- Students must interact directly with their environment in order to experience
 and appreciate the real-world value of their skills and knowledge. With the
 world as classroom, lab and shop, lessons are forever linked to vivid personal
 learning experiences.
- Respect for self and others, enjoyment of diversity, personal commitment to equality, devotion to stewardship, and acceptance of responsibility are essential pillars of the Vermont Commons education and values system.
- Recognizing that the relationships between students and adults form
 the fabric of the Vermont Commons experience, daily life in our school is
 organized to promote healthy, positive, mutually enjoyable interactions
 among students, teachers and staff members.

THE FOUR PILLARS OF OUR STRATEGIC PLAN

I PROGRAMS

Through the Strategic Plan we will create a student experience that sets high standards for academic competence, personal and intellectual development, and opportunities for leadership. By focusing the programs on increased local, regional and global engagement, as well as the tenets of sustainability and ecological citizenship, we will establish our reputation as a model school for experiential learning and global immersion.

Academics

- The VCS curriculum will consistently reflect the Mission and Guiding Principles in all disciplines.
- We will ground our curricula in a global context, addressing and reflecting the larger world within and across disciplines.
- We will create a Professional
 Development program, tailored to
 our mission and vision, for faculty,
 staff, administration, and Board
 members to ensure their personal
 and professional growth.



- We will create an integrated technology program that enhances student and faculty experience at every level, supports the administration of the school, and provides for the implementation of 21st century skills throughout the curriculum.
- We will actively seek ways to spread awareness of our vision, our curriculum and our achievements among independent and public schools in Vermont, New England, and beyond - becoming recognized for unique approaches to teaching and learning.

Health and Wellness

- VCS will devise and implement a Wellness Program that is informative and adaptable; provides age-appropriate knowledge to the students and guidance for faculty, administrators, and parents; and offers opportunities for student leadership.
- We will continue to develop and support a physical education program that is built on active participation of our faculty; fosters mutual respect and trust; and offers a safe environment for exploring healthy choices.



Extracurricular Activities

- VCS will have a Division IV-quality interscholastic sports program that
 focuses on athletic skill development and leadership opportunities; develops
 traditional school rivalries; and establishes the reputation of VCS as an
 inclusive and competitive independent school.
- We will design and implement an engaging and permanent after-school program as well as clubs created and directed by the students.
- We will expand our current menu of extracurricular programs to include a strong music program available to all students.



II COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

- We will create a VCS culture where students, faculty, staff, families, and trustees will make positive contributions to society by focusing on community engagement and building productive and reciprocal local, national and global relationships.
- VCS students will develop the vision, critical thinking skills, and awareness of community context that are the building blocks of proactive citizenship in the world.
- Students will participate in short- and long-term projects with sister schools and organizations at local, regional and global levels.
- VCS will emphasize the diplomacy, communication skills and mastery of tools needed to engage effectively in all relationships.
- VCS faculty and students will exhibit or publish the results of projects, innovations, and programs.
- Through academic and non-academic means, VCS will actively participate in and support programs and activities beyond the school that exemplify our mission and vision.




III FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP & SCHOOL GROWTH

- We will build a strong financial foundation to ensure that VCS succeeds in all
 aspects of this Strategic Plan, consistently achieves our mission, and secures
 our school for the future. We will strengthen and direct our fiscal resources to
 promote and sustain our values and priorities.
- We will increase enrollment to 120 students by FY2015 while evaluating potential further growth to 180.
- We will adopt financial benchmarks consonant with other schools in our cohort, and incorporate the financial needs of each initiative of this Plan in a five-year Strategic Financial Plan.
- To ensure our future financial stability and assist the daily operations of the school we will expand our endowment to \$1,000,000 by FY2015 through a Comprehensive Campaign and reserve fund transfers.
- We will bring employee salaries and benefits in line with our regional cohort of independent schools as our financial base allows.



IV THE COMMONS CAMPUS

- We will create a "Commons Campus" that provides a physical environment using sustainable design strategies to support enhanced programs and increased enrollment.
- VCS will establish a multiyear Capital Plan to develop and fund a Commons Campus with a commitment to sustainability and ecological citizenship.
 Students will participate from concept to construction.
- We will establish a Building Program Plan consonant with the program and facilities assessments. The plan will encompass a carbon-neutral strategy and additional green space.
- In alignment with the strategic financial plan, VCS will launch a Comprehensive Campaign to realize the creation of the Commons Campus.
